

A Letter from The President

Dear Loyal Member,

As we close on 111 years of serving the members in our communities, I would like to thank our members for their dedication to St. Jean's Credit Union. With the continuation of a pandemic, and multiple variants of COVID-19, once again we have been put to the test in 2021. Times like these are when the Credit Union principles shine through—we are a cooperative financial institution with an existence to serve our membership living by the credit union motto, "people helping people." Throughout 2021 we continued to pivot, always keeping our members' financial wellness our priority while maintaining strength throughout the Credit Union.

As an essential service, St. Jean's Credit Union remained open and was able to provide services to our communities while keeping our employees and members safe by implementing sanitation and social distancing standards outlined by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. We did our best to communicate and educate members on the use of online and mobile banking services, allowing members to perform banking transactions from home, while reserving in-branch visits for those services that could only be done in-branch.

In May of 2021, St. Jean's launched a new website. From the beginning of the project, we identified two primary goals: 1) Make it simple, personal, and relationship-focused, 2) Stand out, don't blend in. Through a streamlined and highly intuitive top navigation, as well as a homepage tool to guide visitors to best-fit products, St. Jean's new website takes members and prospects where they need to go, and the bright color scheme and bold design instantly make the website stand out.

In June of 2021, St. Jean's was the recipient of a second round of funds issued by the Federal Home Loan Bank of Boston Jobs for New England Recovery Grant Program, allowing St. Jean's to award an additional \$50,000 in grants to local businesses and non-profit organizations. This second round of grants allowed St. Jean's Credit Union to further support our local small businesses and non-profit organizations that continue to endure negative financial impact from COVID-19.

St. Jean's Credit Union finished the year financially secure and in a position to persevere and grow. We are looking forward to 2022 and remain optimistic that we will continue to be able to provide the very best financial services and support for our members. A major initiative for 2022 is the implementation of online account opening as well as an online payment portal, allowing for an easier and more efficient banking experience. These initiatives will launch in early 2022.

In closing, I would like to take a moment to thank our staff. Their commitment to our members never wavered and they continue to come to work each day, ready to serve our membership and support our communities. And once again, thank you to our members for their patience and support. It has been a pleasure to assist in any way possible, and we could not have done it without them. 2021 has proven that we are stronger when we are united.

A Letter from the Chair, Board of Directors

As I look back on 2021, year-two of living with COVID-19 impacting every part of our lives, I maintain my sense of awe and pride in the way that the St. Jean's Credit Union team continued to support one another and to find innovative ways to meet our members' needs. We were delighted to re-open branches and interact more intimately with our valued members, while curbside service and in-branch appointments were kept as alternate ways to conduct business.

In addition to Online Banking, Mobile Banking, Remote Deposit Capture and ATM machines as integral part of members' banking experience, we rolled out a new website, and continued to find new and efficient ways to communicate with our members under the most challenging of circumstances. Our staff maintained strict focus on providing excellent services and modernized digital tools to members – further ensuring they were equipped with what they needed to manage their finances safely and securely.

St. Jean's is the first state chartered credit union in Massachusetts, serving members since 1910, originally operating out of a Parish in Lynn with an initial deposit of \$5.00. Displaying incredible growth through consistent service to our community, in December of 2021, St. Jean's Credit Union and the Revere Municipal Employees Federal Credit Union signed papers for a merger. The merger blends the Lynn-based St. Jean's 17,000 members and \$319 million in assets, with Revere Municipal's 2,200 municipal employees in the City of Revere and the Town of Winthrop and it's \$18 million in assets. Our team will continue to look for ways to grow and serve our membership by partnering and collaborating with other institutions.

In 2021, St. Jean's Credit Union was the recipient of the second round of funds issued by the Federal Home Loan Bank of Boston Jobs for New England Recovery Grant Program. St. Jean's Credit Union was conferred six grants, totaling \$50,000.00, which was in turn awarded to small businesses and community-based non-profit organizations offering assistance in the same manner as was done in 2020. This additional level of service to our communities was needed and welcomed as we all worked through hard times.

As we plan for 2022 and beyond, we will continue to assist and support our members and our communities while always focusing on the values that have made our institution so unique. I am honored to serve on the Board of such an historic and vital organization. On behalf of the Board of Directors, we extend sincere thanks to our loyal employees and valued members for their dedication and look forward continued successes.


